Menlo Commons drawings

As a mechanical engineer by training and habit, I expressed my interest in Menlo Commons drawings for the purpose of learning about the facilities here, plumbing systems and more. The board gave me access to well over 100 construction drawings, scanned full size to pdf in the summer of 2017. I undertook to see if these could be made more accessible by lifting portions of these drawings into legal size pages (which show well on a screen and print to regular paper). I created a set for each building from garage to penthouse, and other sets that feature unit layouts. Four so far, covering 78 units. There are 23 different floor plans at Menlo Commons, from 1A to 2Y. I count 14 ea 1A (1 bd, 1 ba, balcony in bldgs A&B), 30 2A corner units, 24 2D stretch units, and 10 2Y penthouse corner units. I figure these will be of interest to any owner considering a remodel, and to a prospective buyer. I will create and post additional unit layout files on request.
