About this temporary, prototype Information Directory....

I took charge of and printed the 2019-2020 Information Directory in August 2019. I have provided updates along the way based on data from orientation meetings with new residents, as well as notices from residents of changed email addresses, typos and such. Up-to-date electronic copies have been provided on request as well as a few up-to-date printed copies. It is time to provide a new, updated edition, but first...

The next election for Board of Directors is slated for January 2021, later than usual due to this year’s changes to California civil code governing Home Owner Association elections.

A friend told me that as Palo Alto Utilities mails their bill, the City of Palo Alto has caught on to the fact that this is one envelope residents are sure to open. So the City encloses a variety of information they want residents to have.

It occurred to me that our Information Directory is one document residents keep close at hand. Considering the education I have received from Val about our buildings and equipment, there is information I want to share with residents, such as about plumbing, and instructions Val wants residents to have, such as whom to call about what.

So I created a draft, adding eight pages to provide instructions, suggesting information residents may find useful.

My fellow board members liked the idea. They have encouraged and worked with me to edit and add content. Appreciation for input is due John Loughlin and Ann Mueller in particular. Participants in the last board workshop liked it too. Duane Clapp contributed a review from his legal perspective suggesting info about fire safety. Susan Monje offered suggestions for clarity and content. Eve Murto suggested a link to emergency alerts. Thanks to all ☺

I have reconciled all this input as best I can and this prototype version is the result.

I am planning for the January 2021 Information Directory, with a new full color cover, and want to share this prototype version of the information section, along with a proof copy of current building, phone and email information.

I am counting on residents to review this prototype with care. Does the information section seem relevant and useful to you? What's wrong or missing? For the phone book section: Do you spot typos or want to make changes to phone numbers, email addresses and such? Would you like to spell out what is a home or cell phone? Want to add a phone number or email address to the person looking after you or your unit? Would you want to say iPhone instead of Cell, so that friends will know they can call using Apple FaceTime?

Note that I do not remove owner data even if the owner has moved out. I update this directory when I receive orientation data about the new owner. I do remove data as I learn that renters have moved out.

Let me have your suggestions, updates and corrections by January so they can be considered before I produce the 2021 Information Directory. You may enter and initial a note in the new Master Directory in the binder in the Commons Room, or contact me: Dag Forssell C-204 mc@forssell.com

You may note that I offer to provide current pdf and printed copies on request. Printed updated copies will not get a color cover, just grey scale like this prototype, but you won't complain, will you? I can offer this because I update my files every time I get new data. I have the laser printer, the paper, the stapler, and printing these is my contribution; a labor of love.

GOOD TO KNOW...ORGANIZATION...

Our Menlo Commons Board of Directors...

...are volunteers who serve our Association. By California civil code the Board of Directors has the fiduciary obligation to protect, maintain, and enhance the value of assets, and is responsible for management and operation of the association. The board has retained the services of our management company, the Manor, to handle day-to-day operations, and the Manor in turn, employs our on-site manager, Val Smith. When you have a concern, please direct your communications as shown on page i. Do not call your volunteer board member friends unless a truly urgent issue demands it.

Association CCRs and Bylaws...

...are our formal governing documents.
A copy is located in the Commons Room.

Menlo Commons Operating Rules ...

...is a 29-page reference drawn from several documents.
A copy is located in the Commons Room. A PDF version is available on request.

Insurance and liability...

...Buildings are owned and insured by the Association.
...Unit owners are **required** to carry an HO-6 policy for content and liability. Tenants are **required** to carry an HO-4 policy.
Failure to carry such insurance puts owners and renters at extreme risk.

If you consider any remodeling changes to your unit...

...such as air conditioning, new bath, new windows etc., see the Menlo Commons Operating Rules. You will have to prepare a remodel request and submit it to the Board and the City. Questions should be directed to the Architectural Committee. For original unit blueprint drawings, contact Dag Forssell.

GOOD TO KNOW...ORGANIZATION...

Committees...

Architecture / Remodel:

Homeowners who want to make upgrades or other changes to their units must confer with the Architecture / Remodel committee to determine what can be done with and without a permit from the City of Menlo Park.

Facilities:

The five Menlo Commons buildings are over 40 years old and require understanding and care of common utilities, ventilation systems, as well as general maintenance and upkeep. This committee works to identify issues and resolve them.

Finance:

The Finance Committee works with the Board to continually review the financial condition of the Association.

Social:

Holiday and other social events are planned by this committee. To use common facilities, residents turn here for reservations.

Nominating:

California civil code governing HOA elections spell out a process for encouraging homeowners to step up to the plate and make a contribution to the community where they live. The challenge is to match the professional needs of the Association with the talents of those wishing to serve as Board member. Owners will receive mailings from The Manor regarding the process and schedule.

COMMUNITY LIVING...

Living together in harmony...

...means paying attention to things, odors and sounds.

Composting:

ALL residents are strongly encouraged to compost. It is simple, easy and saves our landfills. It also reduces plumbing issues which we all pay for. Please collect food scraps, pizza boxes, used paper plates, flowers, coffee grounds, and paper food containers and empty them in the big green container right inside the Menlo Commons main driveway entry.

Recycling:

ALL residents are strongly urged to recycle various household waste. Glass, metal, paper, aluminum foil, clean cardboard, plastic jars, and bottles, can be recycled. Check for the recycle symbol if not sure. Styrofoam, bubble wrap and plastic bags cannot be recycled. Place recyclable materials in the large blue bins located in the garage.

Trash:

What cannot be composted or recycled (clothing, broken glass/china), can be placed in plastic bags, tied securely, and placed in the trash chute on each floor. Large items should be carried to the garage level trash room.

Pets:

Are welcome companions, but should neither be seen nor heard in ways that disturb your neighbors. Never bring pets into the Commons Room. Please walk your pets for toilet purposes outside of the fenced interior courtyard, and pick up droppings right away. Place waste in one of the two exterior pet waste collection baskets. Please—kitty litter must be carefully bagged and sealed before being placed in garbage chutes.

COMMUNITY LIVING...

Independent of the board, residents can and do organize activities such as:

Emergency preparedness, Movie nights, Mahjong, Bridge, Exercise, Swimming, Walking, Hiking, Shopping, Swapping books and equipment, Picnics in nearby parks, Communal dining (scheduled, spontaneous, indoors or out). Book clubs, Discussion groups, Lectures, Town Hall meetings.

Communications...

The Board communicates:

- 1 Notices of HOA meetings are posted on bulletin boards located near mail boxes in each building.
- 2 Important materials are sent via the US Mail to owners of record.

Residents communicate between themselves:

- 1 By telephone.
- 2 By email.
- 3 By Door drops.
- 4 By posting on general purpose bulletin boards located in the elevator lobby on the garage level.

GOOD TO KNOW...BUILDINGS...

Plumbing

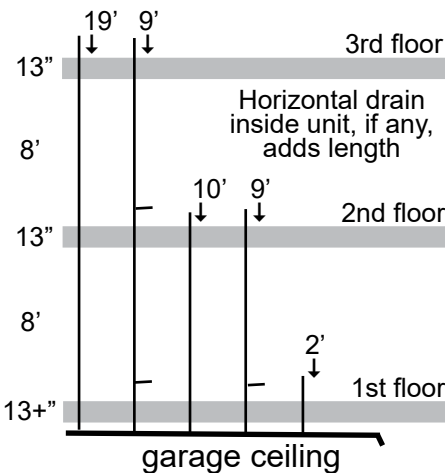
It is **IMPORTANT** that we all **avoid** clogging drains by flushing excess toilet paper, (single thickness recommended) hygiene products and/or wipes down the toilet drains. **Wipes may claim you can flush them, but please don't.** Clogs in the garage ceiling sewer pipes cause flooding—water coming up into toilets and sinks.

Kitchen drains can clog from fat and foods. Never pour grease down the drain. A sieve in your sink can catch tea leaves and anything else so you can dump them in compost.

When it is determined... that a certain unit caused a blockage, the owner may be held responsible for all repair costs.

Toilet, bathroom, kitchen drains...

...all empty into the pipes suspended in our garage ceilings.



Some drains on the 3rd floor drain 19 ft straight down.

Some drains on the 3rd floor drain 9 ft straight down, then join 2nd floor drains.

Most drains on the second floor join drains on the first floor 9 ft down.

Most toilets drain straight to the garage level.

Of course, all drains are vented to the roof.

The San Mateo County alert system, **SMC ALERT** is an alert notification system used to immediately contact you during urgent or emergency situations. To sign up: hsd.smcsheriff.com/smcalert

In case of a power outage...

- ... Emergency lights in hallways and stairs turn on; they have a battery life of approximately 4 hours.
- ... Elevators descend and doors open.
To use the elevator emergency phone, just open door and press button. Staff stands by to take your call 24/7.
- ... Garage gates open and stay open for the duration of the power outage

Hallway ventilation and heating...

... is designed to provide fresh, outside, nighttime air year round.

Please conserve water...

... we use water for irrigation, our pool, and personal use, and it adds up to substantial expense.

Commons room...

... is a major feature of Menlo Commons. For numerous specifics, see the Menlo Commons Operating Rules located here. Reservations are available for private use.

Commons room kitchen...

... is well equipped to support substantial parties in the Commons Room. Reservations are available for private use.

Gym in bldg E...

... hours are from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm, seven days a week. See Menlo Commons Operating Rules located in the Commons Room.

Community pool...

... is available to residents and adult guests from 6 am to 10 pm. Please observe posted rules.
